On Monday, 13th March a number of staff travelled to Bradford to celebrate **The Enquire Learning Trust's 10th Year Anniversary**. The conference brought together all 30 Academies from all three hubs. Mrs Osborne and the team who stayed at Oakdene powered through one of our Academy Improvement Priorities: **Embedding Retrieval Practice** in all curriculum subjects. Retrieval practice is a teaching and learning strategy that can be used inside or outside of the classroom to help children learn. Retrieval practice focuses on getting information out of the memory. The aim is to support pupils' **long term memory** and to help them to **'know more and remember more'**.

Fundamental British Values

Fundamental British values are an integral part of our curriculum, ensuring children become valuable and fully rounded members of society who treat others with respect and tolerance, regardless of background. Every school must promote the basic British values of **democracy**, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual **respect** and **tolerance** for those of different faiths and beliefs. National Careers Week

For many years we have built a careers programme into the Oakdene curriculum. Last week teachers planned activities which aimed to raise aspirations, improve motivation, promote equality of opportunity, celebrate diversity, challenge stereotypes and prepare learners for their future careers.

Y3L & 3/4H virtually met a range of maritime professionals, from working in the City of London, to cleaning the oceans of plastics or designing a superyacht. The maritime sector presents a wealth of opportunities. In the session, children learnt about these jobs and day to day activities, asked questions through an interactive Q&A and picked up fun facts along the way through quizzes.





With the chance to experience a wonderful range of wildlife that lies in the heart of our industrial landscape, RSPB Saltholme provided an exciting base for the Y4s to consolidate their knowledge and understanding of their science topic 'Living Things & Their Habitats'.
