If you are not collecting your child, please ensure that other family members are informed of how they can access the school site.

Online Safety

Teaching Online Safety is an importing part of **keeping our children safe.** We do this mainly through the **computing curriculum** in school using age appropriate resources to demonstrate the risks and how to avoid them. It is very important that children take these messages with them at the end of the school day and are **supported when using technology at home.** Each and every adult has a responsibility to protect children and this includes when they are on line. Technology changes at a fast pace. We recognise that, as parents and carers, it is a challenge to try to keep up with how to keep children safe whilst they access technology. So as a school we subscribe to a monthly online newsletter for parents and carers. In addition, Childline and O2 have teamed up to offer a free helpline for parents/carers for any queries you may have regarding online activity, this could just be simple queries about online gaming or parental controls. The free phone number is **0808 800 5002.** There are times when something uncomfortable happens while online. Please talk to your children about letting a trusted adult know if something they see of hear feels 'uncomfortable'. Children need to know that if this happens they have not done anything wrong.

Year 5's attended an **employability** workshop at **Teesworks Academy**. This was a very informative session which provided children with the opportunity to consider what **careers** they might like to do when they leave school. At the start of the session, the children created a list of the jobs they 'thought' were available to them around our local area. The list included supermarkets, takeaways and retail stores. The children were then asked what they would like to do when they leave school. There was a variety of answers ranging from working in supermarkets, clothes stores to taking over the family business.

The children were then provided with a **history** of Teesside. They used the Google Maps app and an iPad and looked at all the business currently around the Tees. They chose a business and after clicking on it on the map, they watched a video which explained what the company did. They met a few of the **employees** and they explained further what their job entailed.

The children explored engineering companies, hospitals, universities, The Globe, advertising, animation, computer programming and many more. They listened to how the Teesworks was currently being developed and what further **job opportunities** were coming to our area. All of the different jobs, right on our doorstep, waiting for them to explore.

By the end of the session, they were very **inspired**. One of the children said, "I always wanted to work in Asda but I love drawing. I want to work in animation now at Teesside University and make the next Disney film." Another child wanted to become a marine biologist. Another, a fashion designer. The workshop **opened their minds** to the possibilities and different **occupations** available in our local area and how accessible they are. They are very excited to **follow their dreams** and hopefully find out more about these jobs, when we visit some of the companies later in the year for a real taster.







Pupils from Year 1 and Willows participated in a Multi-skills Festival on Friday. The Festival was designed to develop children's fundamental movement skills. Multi-Skill festivals include a rotation of multi-skill activities, eg, jumping, skipping, throwing, Catching, gymnastics, karate, team games and yoga which challenged the children to achieve their personal best.

Developing fundamental movement skills from a young age supports young people to be happy, healthy and confident movers, with the essential skills they need to develop a life-long love of being physically active. The children had an amazing time and activity leaders expressed how much they would like Oakdene to attend School Sports Partnership events again for their exemplary behaviour and listening skills.
