Recommended Read

This week's recommended read is from Miss Robinson 'Junk DNA' by Clare Thompson



Junk DNA is a 32-page wordless comic. It has been created from the arrangement of recycled loose parts including nuts, bolts, old scrap metal items, keys, spanners, spark plugs, light bulbs, watch parts and torn paper.

It shows how loose parts can be used to great effect in storytelling and to convey complex messages.

Children enjoyed Virtual Author Workshops with Tom Percival & Chris Callaghan. Author and illustrator Tom Percival introduced the different personalities in his new Dream Team series. Chris Callaghan was raised in a Shipyard town on the banks of the Tyne. He struggled with reading as a boy, and preferred writing stories, never dreaming that one day he might become a published author himself. But he did! He enjoys sharing his love of reading and writing, and encouraging children just like he was that stories are for everyone.





Open The Book

KS1 pupils watched and joined in a performance from local church volunteers depicting the **Easter Story**. The children explored the story of **Holy Week** and Easter in drama, music and art during the past few weeks.

They have learnt about the death and resurrection of Jesus; about the **Biblical characters** and evidence from history and the different emotions we may experience as we engage with this.

Y1 enjoyed making their **Easter loaves** too as part of their DT curriculum.





Y5 enjoyed the suspense of their class novel-Room 13 written by the acclaimed award-winning children's author Robert Swindells. Published in 1989, it centres around a group of friends, on a school trip, who stay in a creepy guest house on Whitby's West Cliff. Studying Whitby has also supported the Geography curriculum. The children visited Whitby and used their orienteering skills to navigate their way through this seaside town. A highlight of the day was the obligatory fish and chips.
