Year 6 SATS Results

We are extremely proud of our Year 6 children who completed their SATS tests in May. Last week, the results were released and we are delighted to report that our **standards remain well above national figures** and Trust averages. A **HUGE** well done to our children and staff.

These results are already phenomenal. We will be making appeals on some reading and grammar, punctuation & spelling papers. No national comparisons have been issued for the higher standard for 2023 yet. We've therefore used national averages for 2022 to compare our greater depth performance. **This is outstanding progress at both expected and the higher standard.** We look forward to welcoming the parents and carers of Y6 pupils to see their children shine in the **Y6 Performance** this week.

Mrs Osborne and I spent two productive days on a Trust leadership residential in Leeds last week. The time was spent **reflecting** on the multiple successes of the year, **identifying next steps** and **planning** for the year ahead.

We were asked by fellow leaders across the Hubs from the North East, Manchester and North East Lincolnshire how we achieve such **high performance year on year.** How have we achieved this and still delivered a **rich curriculum** ... not a SATs factory? How have we delivered at every phase with so many changes in leaders, teaching staff and TAs in the last year? **Recruitment** is key. We employ staff that are **passionate** about making a difference to **the whole child,** both **pastorally** and **academically.** We pride ourselves on building **positive partnerships** with parents and carers. Being outdoors is a great poost for their mental and physical health. It was wonderful to see them return to school talking of Camaraderie around the Campfire, enjoying nature and Creating magical memories with their teaching team and classmates. It was a chance to work together and bring closure to their primary school experience.
