Dear Parents/Carers

Thank you to all of you who attended appointments to see class teachers on parent/carer consultation evenings. It is always important to meet up early in the academic year to let you know how your child has settled, to share the progress that your child is making and to identify the next steps. We thank you for your continued support. Extra-curricular clubs will resume this week.

Our **Fabulous Fundraising** is just one shining example of how kindness can make a huge difference to others. I've been asked to say **a huge thank you** from our **School Councillors and Rights Respecting Ambassadors** for your generosity supporting charities during these unprecedented times. The **British Legion Poppies** proved to be very popular and the **'Children In Need Day'** raised £324.55 for this amazing cause.

It's that time of year when we plan for the challenges that the weather may bring. Many of you have opted for your child to receive the **nasal flu spray** to reduce the risk of your child/ren being hospitalised due to flu and to protect vulnerable family members.

We have been asked to be prepared for the change in temperature. Please ensure your child/ren bring warm coats and suitable footwear to school each day. Mrs Jackson and the Friends of Oakdene were delighted to see so many of you taking advantage of the recent 'coats for all event'.

It is always difficult to predict what the weather conditions will be like. Therefore, the decision to open the school is made daily. These decisions take into account multiple factors and are only confirmed once we are certain the school can operate safely and provide the appropriate level of supervision for the children. We aim to make this decision as early as possible so that we can inform parents and carers promptly, understanding that alternative childcare arrangements may need to be made. In 19 years of headship, we have only closed for four school days due to snow. Please also remember that while some staff live locally, many travel considerable distances from areas such as North Yorkshire, Sunderland, and Durham. The weather can really vary from one town to another.

In the case of 'emergency closures' the school has a clear protocol to follow. Announcements would be made on Marvellous Me, Stockton Borough Council's website and also by local television and radio stations. Parents and carers are more than welcome to phone the school from 8.30am onwards before setting out on their journey, if you are concerned in anyway.
