This is a fantastic opportunity to engage our pupils with real engineers who will convey the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) in their daily lives. Pupils let their creativity run free as they drew and wrote about how they interpret the question and come up with inventions and ideas.

Many children purchased science themed gadgets from our **science shop** - from volcano kits and magnets to rocket balloons and dinosaur fossil digging kits! We made a $\pounds 60$ profit. **Thank you** for supporting this.
