It's that time of year when we plan for the challenges that the weather may bring. Many of you took up the **nasal flu spray** last week to reduce the risk of your child/ren being hospitalised due to flu and to protect vulnerable family members. We have been asked to be prepared for the change in temperature. **Please ensure your child/ren bring warm coats and suitable footwear to school each day.** 

It is difficult to predict what the conditions will be like this year. The weather may vary from day to day, so a decision to open the school is made each day. As there are many factors to take into account, these decisions are made once it is clear whether the school is able to operate safely and with the correct level of supervision for the children. We endeavour to make the decision as early as possible in order for us to communicate this with parents/carers, as we appreciate that alternative childcare arrangements are often required. In 18 years of headship we have only closed for four school days due to snow. Please remember that some staff live locally whilst many staff travel much further from North Yorkshire, Sunderland and Durham.

In the case of 'emergency closures' the school has a clear protocol to follow. Announcements would be made on Marvellous Me, Stockton Borough Council's website and also by local television and radio stations. Parents and carers are more than welcome to phone the school from 8.30am onwards before setting out on their journey, if they are concerned in anyway.

## Reception Places for September 2025

If your child was born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021, they will be able to start school in **September 2025**. Parents must apply online for a reception place at Oakdene via the Stockton Borough Council website.

We will be holding our second open evening on Wednesday, 27th November 2024 at 4.15pm for prospective parents/carers to visit and look around our exceptional Early Years environment.

We are trying to boost numbers so that we can have two small classes.









Y3 pupils enjoyed spending the day as Vikings in a replica Viking settlement based on the outskirts of York. The unique educational environment formed part of the history curriculum on their study of Invaders and Settlers. Danelaw Dark Age Village contains a number of houses, workshops and fields, offering an atmospheric and hands-on learning environment. During the course of the day, the Y3s were **farmers**, hoeing the field and craftsmen, making clay oil lamps. Children dressed up in **period-costumes** and carried out a range of activities. They performed household tasks that involved collecting firewood and grinding wheat to make bread. Guard training was given to help the new settlers protect the village from marauding Saxons.









Year 4 visited **Hartlepool Power Station** as part of their **electricity** topic in **science**. As they were given a guided tour, the Y4s learnt how the power station produces electricity.

In the afternoon, the Y4s completed a **K'NEX STEM** workshop, where they worked **collaboratively** in groups to create an electricity **pylon**, using K'NEX, which met a set of criteria (including height and sturdiness).
