Head Teacher unions have shared their concerns about some aspects of the mathematics tests this year. I will be adding my **voice** and **sharing my concerns** at the next Primary Head Teacher Reference Group in London.

**Thank you** as well to all the parents and carers who have given such positive support to the children, school and staff for the SATs tests. I am sure that you will appreciate how hard everyone has worked, not only to **prepare** children for the tests but to ensure that a **balance** has been maintained with the other subjects in the curriculum. Thank you to all the adults who have been involved in supporting and preparing the children for this week. Last Friday the Year 6's took the train to Seaton Carew. The children enjoyed a **fun-filled** day of bowling at Larry's Lanes with a delicious meal, time for playing in the arcades, a walk on the beach and time on the playground- a well deserved post-SATs-week **treat.** 

#### **Upcoming Assessments**

This term ahead continues to be very busy, full of assessments to **capture** how much **progress** the children have made and to benchmark them nationally against other schools. On our return to school after half-term, children in **Year 1** will take part in the **phonics screening check**. Thank you to all Y1 parents/carers for supporting at home. The last set of statutory assessments are for Year 4 who will be completing their **multiplications tables check** (MTC). This year the government made the Y2 SATs optional. We opted out. The staff and children are currently working extremely hard in all year groups to ensure the children are as well prepared as they can be. Please make sure that your child **attends** school **regularly**. Everyday really does count.

### Recommended Read

This week's recommended read is from Mr Horkan 'The Wild Robot'

Mr Horkan has road tested this book and has selected it as a whole class text for Y3s.

The Wild Robot is a captivating story combining nature and technology in an unforgettable way. When robot Roz wakes up on a remote island, she faces the challenge of survival.

With vivid illustrations, the story unfolds with heartwarming moments and unexpected twists - making it a personal favourite of mine!

Year 6 are currently reading 'Pig Heart Boy' by Malorie Blackman. In English lessons, the children are writing a balanced argument on the pros and cons of using animal organs in humans (Xenotransplantation). As part of their research on the topic, Kieran Bowden, a PhD student from the School of Medicine and Population Health at Sheffield University, spoke to the children, through Zoom on Friday, 10th-May. The Y6s posed various questions to Kieran, about the work he does with animals in his current research and questions related to his role in the university. Kieran provided the children with valuable information, direct from a working medical scientist, to help them with their writing and enhance their knowledge in the role of animals in research.








We are delighted that our 'Bid' for a **Brilliant Box of Books** from **Read for Good** was successful!
