Good Mental Health is just as important as good physical health. Our Senior Mental Health Lead in school, Mrs Osborne, has circulated the summer term's Mental Health Support Team (MHST) Parent/carer Newsletter from Alliance (it is also uploaded to our website with newsletters). These MHST newsletters are distributed each term to keep you up to date with what they have been up to and provide you with key information and support from the Mental Health Support Team. Two examples of what's on offer include:

Parent-Led Groups—evidence-based interventions for parents of children aged 5-12 year olds with **anxiety** or challenging behaviours. Tools and techniques are provided for practice between sessions.

The Bread and Butter Thing in Stockton & Hartlepool offers high-quality, low-cost food through a mobile food club. Membership allows access to 3 bags of food for £8.50 containing fresh produce, chilled items, and cupboard staples. The initiative aims to reduce waste and living costs.

In this deceptively simple wordless picture book, a small girl finds the end of a long black line and picks it up. She wiggles the line, slides down it and spins inside circles made from it. In her hands, the line transforms into bubbles to blow, a jungle vine to swing from and a tightrope to balance on.

Young children will become instantly involved in this story, curious to see what's next for the magical line that is transformed again and again, and delighted by the surprise on the last page, where the drawer of the line is revealed.

Dodgeball is highly inclusive and any child can take part and enjoy the benefits of playing this fun game. Y5s have been perfecting their key skills such as catching, throwing, movement and teamwork to prepare for their competition on Friday.

Although they won against two of the top 3 teams they narrowly missed 3rd place by 1 point.


