





It was amazing to see how **engaged** and **enthusiastic** our new Reception children were as they experienced a carousel of activities linked to their 'Superhero' topic.

Activities included:- playing superhero games, creating a vegetable healthy hero, inspired by the text Supertato, and an introduction to 'Mighty Maths'. Mrs Osborne and I were so impressed with the superhero reading. It was great to see the children so eager to read speed words and to have a formal introduction to the Oxford Reading Tree characters. Sharing a book with your child each day for just five minutes will make a huge difference to their progress in the Early Years and will establish excellent early reading habits for their time at Oakdene.
