Toby proudly brought his shiny trophy into the celebration assembly for all to see.




Congratulations to **Amber Hammond** (Y4) who achieved her Stage 6 in gymnastics.

Reading

The scheme used for early reading is **'Oxford Reading Tree'** to ensure children have books that are matched to their **reading ability** and **phonic phase.** Children have access to online books using **MyOn** matched to their phonic phase that they can access in school and at home.

'Accelerated Reader' is an online programme successfully used across Y2 and all Key Stage 2 classes. AR is an online programme that aims to **foster the habit of independent reading.** With a vast collection of books available in our library, the children have ample opportunity to select books that are of interest to them and within their reading ability. Pupils take computerised **quizzes** on the books they have read to check their understanding and earn AR points for their hard work.
