We've held two more hugely successful Open Mornings for the parents & Carers of Y3 and Y4 pupils. The activities linked to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). In Y3 they included Technology-coding, Engineering—creating an Eiffel Tower structure, Mathematics—playing Mathopoly Arithmetic Challenge Children v Parents/Carers and oracy—exploratory talk about places/experiences.









Y4's activities included: **Science**—designing an experiment to analyse which drinks contain the most sugar, **Technology**—coding, **Engineering**—building a structure linked to art & **oracy**— sharing the work from key poet, Joseph Coelho.









Y1 pupils got up close to legendary locomotives at the **Shildon Railway Museum**, depicting how the railways have shaped our world.

The children handled a variety of authentic objects associated with the life and achievements of **George Stephenson**. Items included models, books, tools, medals and miners' lamps.









Year 5 and Y6 enjoyed a dance workshop with **Dance City North East** providing them a taster session of what to expect at a professional dance class.

The children learnt a **choreographed** routine to an **instrumental** piece of music.

They then were invited to choreograph their own **interpretive** dance in pairs to demonstrate the journey of a firefly.







Mrs Osborne has once again led a weekly lunchtime Book Club with Y5s as we have been involved in the **Stockton Children's Book of the Year** project. The SCBY award celebrates the best in children's fiction. Each year, five books are **shortlisted** by library staff and shared with children in Years 5 and 6 from primary schools across the borough to vote for their favourite. The winner for **2025** was **The Final Year by Matt Goodfellow.**

Our children's high quality work really impressed Angela Foster (Billingham Librarian). Many congratulations to **Amez Ali** who was awarded with a certificate for the **Best Book Review** and **Ava Hammond** was recognised for her **outstanding effort** at a **prestigious awards ceremony** with the **Mayor.** Arta and Indi also met all 5 authors: **Bex Hogan, Emily Randall-Jones, Matt Goodfellow, Josh Lacey** and **Rachel Delahaye.**

All the children involved in the project from Oakdene and Roseberry Primary, plus our Y5 and Y6 pupils, had the opportunity to meet the brilliant author **Matt Goodfellow.** Matt is the **key poet** for Upper KS2 so the children were delighted to buy signed copies of his **award winning book.**







Y2 visit the **Washington Wetlands** each year to prepare a **launchpad** for their **science** topic in the Summer Term. During this school visit, children met characters from a **digital storybook** – including Ava in life-size puppet form at her giant nest. She challenged them to discover the secrets of her story from the animals on site and designed magical listening devices that enabled the children to hear what they were saying. The children eagerly carried out **nature connection** activities to show that they care about nature. To reward them, the animals revealed their secrets. This memorable visit culminated with the children helping Ava to fly. She disappeared into the distance as she began her long journey to West Africa where she hoped to be re-united with her family. There, she will also have the chance to present to the **Guardians of the Wild**, a council of animals that protect nature.

Children, teachers and family members were provided with logins on return to school. They can access a specially designed website where Ava's story continues through a series of updates from her journey. Children are encouraged to complete nature activities in school and with their families to collect virtual badges. The Guardians have promised that any child who demonstrates they are willing to reconnect with nature can themselves become Guardians of the Wild, an honour not bestowed on humans for thousands of years. Will they do enough to be welcomed as a Guardian and receive their Guardian certificate and membership badge?







Last week we celebrated **British Science Week.** Mrs Cowan organised an exciting series of activities and events to help promote the benefits of scientific involvement. Little Sycamores planted seeds, explored gloop and bubbles. Nursery were enthralled by cockroaches, crickets, grubs & stick insects. Reception enjoyed learning about the diet of their special visitors - the newly hatched **chicks,** who they have loved observing **change** and **growth.** Year 1s used their knowledge of **materials** to 'protect the egg' - they purchased items with their £1 budget from the Oakdene shop and once they were happy with their design, dropped the egg from the upstairs window! Only one egg survived the drop!

Year 2 enjoyed a visit into the forest area linked to their learning on living things - they conducted a **microhabitat survey** and hunted for minibeasts! Year 3s created their own fossils and learnt about their **key scientist - Mary Anning.** In Year 4, the children took part in a BBC Live Lesson - hosted by **Tim Peake** from the ISS. One of the highlights for pupils in Y5 and Y6 was a visit from **two scientists** from **FUJIFILM** in Billingham. They explained their career and their route into FUJIFILM. The children loved competing in a race to see who could get into **protective clothing** the fastest!

Many children purchased science-themed gadgets from our **science shop** - from volcano kits and magnets to rocket balloons and dinosaur fossil digging kits! **Thank you** for supporting this.

The children sang with great enthusiasm and really enjoyed the experience. It was wonderful to hear from teachers, parents and Carers how proud our children made them feel.
