

The theme of the activities was based on **STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) and activities included: **Science** - understanding the difference between acid and alkali, **Technology** - Cracking coding with micro-bits, **Mathematics** - to Celebrate World Maths Day, Y5 created Fibonacci spirals and the Escape Room problem solving activity. Recommended Read This week's recommended read is from Eliza-Grace Mack in Y3 'Big Panda & Tiny Dragon' By James Norbury



On Saturday it was four years since the first National Lockdown in 2020. Eliza's Mam bought this beautiful book to read during lock-down.

This is a story about two friends who journey through the seasons of the year together. It shows you how to be a good friend and the hardships & happiness that connect us all. Eliza especially likes p.40 in Spring,

'You must discover your own path.'

Y5 enjoyed the suspense of their **class novel** -**Room 13**, written by the acclaimed award-winning children's author Robert Swindells. Published in 1989, it centres around a group of friends on a school trip, who stay in a creepy guest house on Whitby's West Cliff. Studying Whitby has also supported the geography curriculum. The children visited Whitby and used their orienteering skills to navigate their way through this seaside town. A highlight of the day was the obligatory fish and chips.



Y2 visit the **Washington Wetlands** each year to prepare a **launchpad** for their **science** topic in the Summer Term. During this school visit, children met characters from a **digital storybook** – including Ava in life-size puppet form at her giant nest. She challenged them to discover the secrets of her story from the animals on site and designed magical listening devices that enabled the children to hear what they were saying. The children eagerly carried out **nature connection** activities to show that they care about nature. To reward them, the animals revealed their secrets. This memorable visit culminated with the children helping Ava to fly. She disappeared into the distance as she began her long journey to West Africa where she hoped to be re-united with her family. There, she will also have the chance to present to the *Guardians of the Wild*, a council of animals that protect nature.

Children, teachers and family members were provided with logins on return to school. They can access a specially designed website where Ava's story continues through a series of updates from her journey. Children are encouraged to complete nature activities in school and with their families to collect virtual badges. The Guardians have promised that any child who demonstrates they are willing to **reconnect** with nature can themselves become <u>Guardians of the Wild</u>, an honour not bestowed on humans for thousands of years. Will they do enough to be welcomed as a Guardian and receive their Guardian certificate and membership badge?
