



Drivers that continue to ignore the requests of our staff will have their details passed on to our local officers at Billingham Police Station.





As part of the Northern Children's Book Festival, and in association with Read North East/National Literacy Trust, our school welcomed the opportunity to engage in a number of different virtual author sessions.

KS2 were enthralled as they met with former Waterstone's Children's Laureate Cressida Cowell. Cressida Cowell, explained how she takes her initial idea and develops it to make a gripping story! The children now have lots of ideas for their own books and characters...

There was also an amazing opportunity to buy signed copies of some of her most popular books: Wizards of Once and Which way to Anywhere.







Y2 enjoyed their visit to **Preston Hall Museum** to support their topic 'What is in the Oakdene Museum Today?' They explored a range of **artefacts in** the **Homes Workshop** as well as in and around the **Museum** which they couldn't believe once was home to the Ropner Family. The children were immersed into a cobbled **Victorian Street** and enjoyed talking to the volunteers working in the shops. The children looked at **careers** from the past. They were especially pleased when each group were given a big bag of traditional sweets to bring back to school. The highlight of the day was meeting **reindeer**—a truly magical experience!





Year 5 had a busy but fun filled day at the Life Science Centre. They explored the Curiosity zone where the children had to think like scientists and explore how things work. Y5s took part in three different science investigations in the science lab. They tested the absorbency of 'Space Nappies', explored the best strawberries to take into space and rebuilt the solar panels on the International Space Centre using a robotic arm. After lunch, the Y5s were excited to demonstrate their ice skating skills on the rink. The Planetarium, invited the Y5s to enjoy watching and listening to the journey through space before finishing the afternoon off with a visit to the science theatre where they learnt all about light and colour.



Inspired by Nick Butterworth's book '**One Snowy Night'** the Y1 children visited the North York Moors. Y1s enjoyed a **visit at the North York Moors National Park** to bring to life their science and Forest School work. Percy left a special message for the Y1 children. The children followed an animal fact file and trail of clues around the grounds of the visitor centre, collecting animal characters from the story and taking part in short activities related to wildlife on the way. The children were invited to take a close look at, and handle, stuffed animals and birds from a woodland habitat including characters from the story. Everyone enjoyed a game of woodland pass the parcel and ended up in a magical Mongolian Yurt, warmed by a log burner, whilst listening to the story and sipping hot chocolate.
