15 hours per week is based on 38 weeks per year (term-time only) but parents can access fewer hours per week over a full year. Eligibility criteria applies to all of the above except for the universal offer for all parents. In addition, you can use Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit to pay for childcare whilst also claiming your 15 or 30 hours of funded childcare.

## Find the right offer for you

Financial support available to working parents to help with childcare costs is increasing from April 2024. Changes will make it easier for parents with childcare responsibilities to move into or take on more paid work.
