Y5 Residential at Streonshalh

In September 2024, the Enquire Learning Trust created a custom built 36 bed field study centre in **Whitby** with the hopes of bringing high quality, outdoor education to children from across the trust. The aim is that every child who attends an Enquire Learning Trust school will get an **all expenses paid trip** to Whitby during their primary school lives and will experience all the amazing things Whitby and the surrounding area has to offer. The centre uses local businesses to enhance the trips the children have, including **fish and chip** shops, **ghost walks** and **boat trips**.

Y5 enjoyed the suspense of their class novel, Room 13, written by the acclaimed award-winning children's author, Robert Swindells. Published in 1989, it centres around a group of friends on a school trip, who stay in a creepy guest house on Whitby's West Cliff. Looking through the lens of the Room 13 text, the Y5s mirrored visits to different places shared with the characters within the book. They visited the lifeboat museum, which enabled the Y5s to understand some of the history of Whitby and how important the RNLI is to our country. The Dracula Experience helped Y5s further understand the myths and mystery behind the character in the story. The heritage trail taught Y5s about other historical events that have taken place throughout Whitby's history, including how William Scoresby (part of the whaling family) invented the crow's nest on ships and who is also the reason behind the polar bear that is visible upon the roof of a shop in Whitby. The trail also linked well with prior knowledge of the Tudors; the Y5s learnt how Henry VIII took the bells from Whitby Abbey, as he wanted them for himself. The ship sunk and the remains are still off the coast of Whitby today. On their final day, the Y5s visited the lobster hatchery to understand the lifecycle of a lobster, this linked with the current science topic of living things and life cycles of plants and animals.

Tiff Rollins (Deputy Centre Manager) emailed me with these fabulous comments:- "I just wanted to drop an email to let you know how much I enjoyed having your Year 5 classes last week. The children were a credit to your school. I was blown away with their respect, kindness and overall attitude to learning. The children wanted to know more and more and they were great at listening, asking questions and having a positive attitude to learning. The staff that supported the children on the visits were just as enthusiastic, supportive and positive. They made the children's visit to Whitby and I am sure the children have all made memories to treasure forever. I wanted to say thank you for sending such an amazing group of children and staff to stay with us last week. I wish they were coming again! "

Some children may be inspired by Spring/Easter, a favourite book character, a topic they've enjoyed learning about, a hobby—be creative!




This is, of course, an optional activity. The eggs will be **judged** on the last day of term, Friday, 11th April 2025.
