	Smart grouping: pairing with a more able reader/ writer		
	<ul> <li>Opportunities for repetition and retrieval of previous learning,</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Provide opportunities for pupils to join in all together or as a group before being invited to play or sing individually.</li> </ul>
