Dear Parents and Carers,

Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance for the year for most year groups is above the national average but some pupils have been disrupted by multiple periods of isolation. We now want to ensure that attendance improves or remains at this high level for the remainder of the year. It is important that children are in school every day that they possibly can be so they do not miss out on **memorable educational activities and opportunities**. We will be continuing to monitor punctuality as well as attendance.

Staggered starts and departs continue. Please make sure your child is at school on time so that they do not miss out on **valuable learning time.** The Education Welfare Officer will be doing **spot check 'late gates'** again from this term. If your child is unwell and not able to attend school, it is essential that parents or carers call the office first thing in the morning to let us know. If we do not have contact and are then unable to contact you this may become a safeguarding concern and the Education Welfare Officer then needs to carry out a home visit. We really value your support in working with us to improve attendance.

It was National Offer Day during the school holidays, Tuesday 19th April, for primary schools. Once again we've received a high volume of applications from other local schools and private day nurseries. **Congratulations** to all our nursery children who were offered a school Reception place for September 2022. We look forward to continuing your learning journey with us. More information will follow after the May half-term break.




