Washington Wetlands Visit: Generation Wild—Ava's Destiny

Y2 visit the Washington wetlands each year. This year, Oakdene has been invited to be involved in a special project. The project was introduced through a digital storybook where Ava's story began. We were provided with a range of curriculum-linked resources so that we could incorporate work on ospreys and wetlands into the teaching.

During the free school visit, children met Ava in life-size puppet form at her giant nest. She challenged them to discover the secrets of her story from the animals on site and designed magical listening devices that enabled the children to hear what they are saying. The children carried out nature connection activities to show that they care about nature. To reward them the animals revealed their secrets.

This memorable visit culminated with the children helping Ava to fly. She disappeared into the distance as she began her long journey to West Africa where she hoped to be re-united with her family. There, she will also have the chance to present to the *Guardians of the Wild*, a council of animals that protect nature.

Children, teachers and family members were provided with log ins on return to school. They can access a specially designed website where Ava's story continues through a series of updates from her journey. Will she fulfil her destiny, find the Guardians and finally be reunited with her family? Children are encouraged to complete nature activities in school and with their families to collect virtual badges. The Guardians have promised that any child who demonstrates they are willing to reconnect with nature can themselves become <u>Guardians of the Wild</u>, an honour not bestowed on humans for thousands of years. Will they do enough to be welcomed as a Guardian and receive their Guardians certificate and membership badge?

KS1 pupils watched and joined in a performance from local church volunteers depicting the **Easter Story.** The children explored the story of **Holy Week** and Easter in drama, music and art during the past few weeks.
