At times like these, the crucial role of the teacher and their true value is shown when they face off-the-cuff questions. Please be assured that, while we are not teaching children about the war in Ukraine, what we are doing is ensuring they have a safe environment to talk about what they see, remember, and are feeling now. The guidance and safety of adults at home and in school enables them to navigate their own emotions and trauma in a healthy, safe and productive way.

Fundamental British Values

Fundamental British values are an integral part of our curriculum, ensuring children become valuable and fully rounded members of society who treat others with respect and tolerance, regardless of background. Every school must promote the basic British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance for those of different faiths and beliefs. This ensures young people understand the importance of respect and leave school fully prepared for life in modern Britain. This must be extended beyond the school gates - modelled by our parents, carers and wider community.


Recommended Read
