


Easter Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF) –

Recommended Read This week's recommended read is from Mrs Rowe 'I an David' by Anne Holm



It tells the story of a young boy who, with the help of a prison guard, escapes from a concentration camp in an unnamed Eastern European country (according to geographical clues, probably Bulgaria) and journeys to Denmark.

Along the way he meets many people who teach him and show him how different life can be. Diversifying our Book Collections Books by black authors and illustrators are essential.
