Right of the Fortnight: Article 27: Your Right to a Good Standard of Living

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Dear Parents/Carers,

Over a number of years, governors and senior leaders regularly review and research the benefits of staying as a maintained Local Authority primary school compared to joining a Multi Academy Trust. The research continued
 through the pandemic and it became evident that, at times, we were at a disadvantage, for example, our allocation of laptops and iPads limited and arrived far too late because we'd managed to keep bubbles open.
 Many Academy Trusts provided an iPad to every child.

In July 2021, the Governing Body agreed formally that this was the right decision for the future of the school and agreed with the match that I presented on behalf of senior leaders. A North East Advisory Board Meeting took place on 11th November 2021 to discuss whether to approve the Academy Order for
 Oakdene Primary School, to convert and join The Enquire Learning Trust. with effect from 1st April 2022. The Chair of Governors was informed by the Department for Education that this was approved. In the new year, consultations will be organised to capture the views of the whole school community. Parents and carers will find out what this change would mean for our school and the benefits for your child.

The theme for last week's **Friendship Week** was **One Kind Word.** Class assemblies linked to One Kind Word have shown how one kind word can make a big difference in the interactions we have with others. The children were engaged and thought carefully about how one kind word or act of kindness can create a 'chain of kindness'.

Kindness is more important today than it has ever been and the isolation of the last year has underlined how little acts of consideration can break down barriers and brighten the lives of the people around us.

Our **Fabulous Fundraising** is just one shining example of how kindness can make a huge difference to others. I've been asked to say a huge thank you from our School Councillors and Rights Respecting Ambassadors for your generosity supporting charities during these unprecedented times. The British Legion merchandise proved to be very popular and the 'Children In Need Day' raised **£245.44.** The children shared that these special days feel even more precious at the moment.

Thank you to all the parents and carers who have demonstrated kindness to other parents/carers and staff by wearing face coverings at drop-off and pick-up times again. Unless you are exempt we strongly encourage
 everybody to do this to protect our staff and essentially keep school open. <u>Public Health England told</u>
 <u>Stockton schools in a meeting last week that this really can help make a difference.</u>

Park to bring to life their science, Forest School and Percy the Park Keeper work. Percy left a special message for the Y1 children. The children followed an animal fact file and trail of clues around the grounds of the visitor centre, collecting animal characters from the story and taking part in short activities related to wildlife on the way. The children were invited to take a close look at, and handle, stuffed animals and birds from a woodland habitat including characters from the story. Everyone enjoyed a game of woodland pass the parcel and ended up in a magical Mongolian Yurt, warmed by a log burner, whilst listening to the story and sipping hot chocolate.
