




Stay at home and self-isolate.

Mike's household: In this example, Mike lives with Georgio, Maria and Seyi. Mike is the first case of COVID-19 in this household. He and everyone in the household begin self-isolating from the day Mike's symptoms start (or if he had no symptoms, from the date of his positive test).



Self-isolate for 10 full days.

You need to self-isolate from the day the first person in your household started symptoms and for the next 10 full days. If they did not have symptoms, self-isolate from the day of their test and for the next 10 full days.

To self-isolate means:

Do not go to work, school, or public areas and do not use public transport or taxis. Only leave your home to get to your test if you need to, observe strict social distancing advice and return immediately afterwards.


There is a group in Frome now.



Go wild for reading with the Summer Reading Challenge 2021!

The Summer Reading Challenge takes place over the summer holidays throughout the UK, and launches on the 10th July 2021. The challenge is the perfect summer activity to build reading skills and confidence during the long break from school. It is also a great boredom-buster should the weather prove to be less than favourable! For 2021 the Reading Agency is partnering with the WWF for Wild World Heroes, a nature-themed challenge that will inspire children to engage with important environmental issues, from plastic pollution and deforestation to wildlife decline and nature loss.

At the heart of the Summer Reading Challenge is children choosing and sharing books of their choice, in any format. Novels, fact books, picture books, graphic novels, joke books, eBooks and audiobooks all count towards completing the challenge. Frome library is currently open and they are ready and waiting to welcome keen readers! Parents or carers can register children for the challenge in the library, and they will need to be library members (registration is free, quick and easy). Children will then receive a map, and for each book they read they will get a sticker to build towards completing the challenge. Alternatively, children can complete the challenge online by signing up via https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk where they can also play games, enter competitions and much more. If completing the challenge online, children can borrow eBooks and audiobooks for free (with a library membership) via the following link: https://www.librarieswest.org.uk/client/en_GB/default

Please note children must read books borrowed via the library, whether physical copies or electronic/audio versions, if completing the challenge online.

There are participation certificates for each child that takes part and medals for those children who read at least six books over the summer, which we hope to be able to present in assemblies in September when we return to school.
