So why did this system contribute to the war?


- The fact that there were so many 'Great Powers' all on each other's doorsteps was bound to cause trouble at some point - the Franco-Prussian War is evidence of that





Great Britain

- At the beginning of the 20th Century,
 Britain was the greatest power in the world
 - She was <u>very rich</u> and was a <u>powerful</u> <u>industrialised country</u>
 - Britain had the <u>largest and most powerful</u> <u>navy</u>
 - She had the <u>largest overseas empire</u>
- The British Empire covered over a quarter of the world's surface
