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Potting Power

This week Ruben Byne 6S has been investigating how plants reproduce. He looked at growth and asexual reproduction.

He had a Mexican hat plant that had grown much too big for its pot. We talked about the roots' need for space to grow and their need for nutrients. He re-potted the plant into a bigger pot and documented each stage in photographs.

He then noticed tiny baby plants forming along the leaf edges. He took some of them and put them into soil to try and obtain new plants. He knew that this was asexual reproduction. We talked about the parent and baby plants being clones and that they are genetically identical. He then searched the house and garden and found two other examples of asexual reproduction.
