


# Drama Prop Room Tidy Up

# Stand Against Violence Workshops Thursday 13th March 2025



This week Year 7 were visited for a workshop session on the wider impacts of violence as

part of their PSHE curriculum in relation to 'Resolving Conflict'. All pupils worked with Nik from Stand Against Violence and explored a real life story and the results of how a young man lost his life tragically in Somerset in 2005 due to violent actions.

The pupils were able to reflect on the potential impacts of making decisions as they grow older and potential ramifications of these choices. Despite the powerful themes explored here, pupils showed respect, courtesy and reflectiveness in their thinking and sharing of ideas.
