OAKFIELD ACADEMY COUNCIL VISITS THE TOWN HALL



We were delighted that four authors were able to join us in person, and another one virtually. We were particularly pleased that local author Catherine Bruton was able to collect her prize!









Fair Frome is a local independent charity serving the community of Frome and surrounding villaes. Its aim is to alleviate the effects of poverty on residents and promote financial, social and health equality through the delivery of timely hands-on projects.

These include:

Food Bank, open 3 times a week, which gives out food parcels with additional items supplied of fresh food like eggs, milk, cheese, butter, as well as toiletries, nappies, Formula milk.

Vouchers are also given for people to choose fresh fruit and veg from a local shop.

Christmas Food and personalised Christmas presents for children, part of The Frome Christmas Get-Together which provides meals on Christmas Day

Food at Five: providing hot meals in 3 different venues, offering a warm space from 4.30-6.30pm and support in a welcoming environment with a cuppa and chat, takeaway meals also provided

Holiday Lunches provided 3 times a week during school holidays

- **Furniture Bank**: repair cookers and washing machines where possible, collect and supply donated items, buy white goods (mostly cookers and washing machines)
- **Community Pantry** providing 60 members and their families with a weekly top-up low cost shop
- Assistance Scheme: Providing school uniforms, refurbished laptops, vouchers for clothes and shoes, heated blankets, transport for appointments, carpets, and many other essential items

Baby Basics Bank- providing baby equipment like cots, prams

Weekly shower and clothes washing facilities for homeless people

Housing advice drop ins, Homeless and Inclusion drop ins, Citizen's advice sessions and digital inclusion drop ins
