

Lunchtime Trials

Over the past two days, we've been trialling a new lunchtime routine to help create a calmer, more enjoyable atmosphere in the lunch hall for everyone.

Pupils are now being asked to enter the hall calmly and quietly, and to take a seat at the tables. Those with packed lunches can begin eating straight away, as usual. Pupils having hot lunches are called up in small groups to collect their food, reducing the need for long queues.

We're encouraging pupils to use good table manners and to keep noise levels low while eating. Once they've finished their lunch, tidied their space, and are sitting quietly, they may leave the hall. This should allow them to enjoy more free time rather than waiting for others to finish. We're introducing these changes now, ahead of the summer break, to begin building positive habits early.

Additionally, many Year 7 and 8 pupils eat their lunch during breaktime. Previously, all pupils were required to attend the lunch hall regardless. We are now trialling a new approach that gives these pupils the option to come into the hall during lunch break if they wish.

We will be gathering feedback from pupils on both of these trials during the final week of term.
