ATTENDANCE

We value attendance and punctuality at Oakfield and whilst we appreciate that we all get ill sometimes and need time to rest and recover, we also understand that school attendance reflects the pupils' sense of belonging to our community. We are working hard to create a safe learning environment that fosters strong relationships and engaging in learning. Our school attendance target is 96% and currently we are at 91.5%, which is just below the national average for similar schools. Pupil punctuality has hugely improved and we appreciate the efforts families have gone to ensure their children are in school on time. This academic year, we have been quicker to spot potential difficulties with attendance and have sent letters, emails and made phone calls to reach out and see how we can support if there are early concerns. If you would like further support to improve your child's attendance or wonder if there is more we can do to support you, please let us know.





Families Learning About Self Harm (FLASH)

WHO IS THE PROGRAMME FOR?

Any adult who has shared responsibility for bringing up a child (11-17 years old) can attend the group including stepparents, grandparents and carers. We welcome parents on their own or with a partner or adult family member. Please note, this group is not intended for families of young people currently under care of Tier 3 CAMHS. For families currently care coordinated by CAMHS East or West teams, please speak to your keyworker who can discuss other FLASH groups with you.

WHAT DOES THE PROGRAMME COVER?

This is a 5-week programme which aims to create better communication and personal relationships between parent/carers and young people. FLASH allows parents the opportunity to discuss the self-harm with people who understand and learn how to manage concerns within your home.

It will include:

- Exploring what self-harm is, what the risks are and what is the function of
- Listening and self-esteem enabling skills
- Managing self-harm within the family environment
 How self-harm impacts on parenting and ways to manage under stressful
- · Coping strategies for parents and carers


