A message from Mr Gough, Head of Science

Dear Parents,

For the last week of term and the first week back we will be working with year 7 & 8 pupils on all the conduct card focuses that we have covered so far. They are as follows:

Walking in the corridors Using the one-way system across the academy Taking pride in our uniform Using appropriate language Being prepared for lessons with the right equipment



The work carried out with pupils on explicitly teaching expectations, has improved behaviour around our academy in years 7 & 8. We will be consolidating this improvement with conduct cards and looking to focus on classroom learning behaviours over the summer term. After Easter we will be introducing conduct cards to year 6 in the same way as we have with the older years. The pupils will be taught the same specific expectations over the summer term. We will support pupils to look after their conduct cards. This will be rolled out to year 5 pupils after the June half term in readiness for year 6.

Feedback from pupils and staff has been very positive. Pupils are showing a better understanding of the importance of good behaviour within our community and many pupils have relished the opportunity to take the responsibility of looking after their card and gaining more merits for their achievements when rising to the challenges set.

Lateness to school

A lot of pupils are arriving late to the Academy at the moment. Please ensure that your child arrives at school so that they are present for registration; this is done at 8.40am and first lesson is at 8.45am every day.

The red gates open from 8.25am; pupils are to register at 8.40am, the red gates close at 8.40am. Any pupils arriving after this time will need to enter school via Reception and sign-in. Any pupils arriving between 8.40am and 9.00am are marked present, with a note of the number of minutes late and any pupils arriving after 9.00am are marked late. Pupils arriving after 9.30am when registers close are marked U –unauthorised.

Update on COVID-19 vaccination for 5 to 11 year olds and 12 to 15 year olds

The in-school COVID-19 vaccination programme will end on Friday 1 April. 12 to 15 year olds will still be able to access the vaccine outside of school, at a vaccination centre, pharmacy or walk-in centre.

Healthy 5 to 11 year olds will be offered the COVID-19 vaccine from the beginning of April. Vaccinations will take place outside of school, in vaccination centres, pharmacies, GP surgeries and walk-in centres. Parents of 5 to 11 year olds will receive a letter from the NHS with further information on the vaccine.

For 5 to 11 year old and 12 to 15 year old vaccinations, please signpost parents to where they can <u>book COVID-19 vaccination</u> <u>appointments online</u>, at a vaccination centre or pharmacy, or <u>find a walk-in COVID-19 vaccination site</u> without needing an appointment. Appointments and walk-ins can be accessed for 12 to 15 year olds now, and bookings will open up for 5 to 11 year olds from the beginning of April.
