Oakfield SATs 2024

Last week saw Oakfield receive some pleasing results for our Year 6 pupils. I would like to take a moment to thank everyone involved in the process from site staff, support staff, teaching staff to most importantly the pupils. The whole process in May was a real success the pupils conducted themselves so well and we all have reaped the rewards of the hard work that went into the days, weeks and months before. Below is a snapshot of the Year groups results overall but it doesn't take into account the vast amount of progress individual children made from when they first joined us.

English Reading 70% achieving Age Related Expectations, up 16% from last year!

English Writing 78% achieving Age Related Expectations, up 9% from last year!

English Grammar 62% achieving Age Related Expectations, up 9% from last year!

Maths 50% achieving Age Related Expectations, up 11% from last year!

Combined Reading, Writing and Maths 43% achieving Age Related Expectations, up 12% from last year!

Last week 8C and 8S used sweets to model the rock cycle, involving eroding the rocks using scissors to form sedimentary rock, applying pressure to flatten and form metamorphic rock & heating and cooling using the Bunsen burners to form magma and igneous rock.

Year 7 RNS have been learning about ecology and undertaken several field studies on analysing the distribution of plant life using quadrats & transects in the harmony garden & school field.
