Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Making Relationships - Prime Area

Show interest in others play and start to join in

Seek out others to share experiences

Show concern and affection for people who are special to them

May form a special friendship with another child

Initiate play, offer cues to peers to join them

Self Confidence and Self Awareness - Prime Area

Separate from main carer with support and encouragement from a familiar adult

Express own preferences and interests

Enjoy responsibility of carrying out small tasks

Show confidence in asking adults for help

Managing Feelings and Behaviour - Prime Area

Seek comfort from adult when needed

Express how they are feeling sad, happy, scared ...

Show understanding and cooperate with some boundaries and routines

Aware that some actions can hurt or harm others

Communication and Language

Listening

Listen with interest when an adult reads a story.

Show an interest in play with sounds, songs and rhymes.

Listen to others 1:1 and in small groups.

Join in with repeated refrains and anticipate evens and phrases in rhymes and stories

Understanding

Can answer 'who', 'what', 'where' guestions.

Understand more complex sentences

Respond to simple instructions.

Know the use of objects

Speaking

Use gesture with some talk.

Use simple sentences.

Use complex sentences using words 'and' and 'because'. Retell a simple past event in order

Literacy

Reading


Has some favourite rhymes, poems and songs. Listen to and joins in with rhymes, poems and songs.

Begin to be aware of the structure of stories. Look at books independently

Writing

Distinguish between the different marks they make.

Hold a pencil between thumb and two fingers to mark make



Physical Development

Moving and Handling - Prime Area

Climb confidently and begin to pull themselves up on Nursery climbing equipment.

Show control in holding and using jugs to pour, hammers, books and mark making tools.

May show a preference for a dominant hand


Health and Self-Care

Clearly communicate toileting needs.

Manage self-care but will seek support of an adult if necessary.

Understand the importance of using tools and equipment safely. Dress

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Expressive arts and design

Exploring Media and Materials

Show an interest in the way musical instruments sounds. Experiment with colour, marks and blocks.

Enjoy dance and ring games.

Begin to move rhythmically.

Being Imaginative

Begin to use representation to communicate.

Begin to pretend play.

Notice what adults do and imitate this in play.

Build stories around toys as they play.

Mathematics

Number

Select a small number of objects from a group when asked

Recite some number names in sequence

Recite numbers in order to 10

Know that numbers identify how many objects are in a set

Shape, Space and Measure

Begin to use language of size

Begin to categorise objects according to properties such as shape or size

Show an interest in shape and space by playing or making arrangements with objects

Show awareness of shape in the environment

Understanding the World

People and Communities

Has a sense of immediate family and friends

In pretend play, imitate actions and events from their family experience

Show an interest in the lives of people they are familiar with Talk about significant events from their own experiences

The World

Enjoy small-world objects e.g. dolls house, farm, train track Comment and ask questions about the place they live in and the natural world

Technology

Seek to acquire basic skills in turning on and operating some ICT equipment

Show an interest in technological toys and real objects
