### Home School Planners

This year, we have taken the decision not to buy our usual Home School Planners. Originally, the planners were provided to give parents/carers information about school dates, routines and ways in which to support children with learning, as well as a record for home reading. As our school website has developed, we have ensured that much of the information from the planner is available online. Therefore, this year, your child will be provided with a reading record book where you can record and comment on your child's reading at home. These books will be checked ONLY on book changing days, so please DO NOT use them for important messages into school. If you need to pass a message to your child's teacher, please contact Mrs Boyle in the office, or speak to Mrs Worthington or Miss Chadwick who are always available at the playground doors in the morning.

By supplying reading records rather than planners, we will save a significant amount of money which will be spent on enhancing the children's learning experiences.

This is the only 'paper' newsletter that we will be sending out from school this year. when subsequent newsletters are posted on the school website, we will send a text alert to let parents/carers know This helps to reduce costs and also ensures that parents/carers have access to the letters (rather than discovering that they have been left in trays, dropped on the way home or made into a paper aeroplane!)
