



Welcome back!

English

In English, we will be reading lots of exciting texts, from Tom Fletcher's adventure story – The Creakers to a newspaper report about an alien sighting! We have started our term with The Creakers, discovering all about some pesky monsters under the bed. We will be writing our own adventure stories, whilst practicing writing direct speech.



Maths

In Maths, we will be learning fractions, shapes and capacity. The children are really excited about the fractions work we have done so far and have already learnt how to convert a fraction to a decimal!

Topic

Our topic for this term is 'The World Outside My Window' Within this topic, we will be learning about important British history. In art, we will be using tone and shade to draw flowers that are local to the north of England. For our design technology project we will be learning how to do a running stitch and back stitch to create a home for a creature. In Science we will be investigating the properties of different types of rocks and will learn about fossilisation.

This term, our P.E. day is Monday and swimming will continue on Tuesday afternoons. We will be practicing athletics and aiming to improve our sprinting and jumping techniques.
