Next Monday, Year Five will be visiting London for the day! We will be departing Oxenholme Train Station at 7.26am and returning to Oxenholme at 8.10pm. During the day, we will be touring the Houses of Parliament, going on the London Eye and visiting the National Portrait Gallery. Thank you to the Year Five parents and carers who came to the meeting after school on Tuesday. For those who couldn't attend, please note the following information:

- Please drop your child off at Oxenholme Train Station between 6.55am 7.05am. A member of staff will be outside the station and on the platform.
- Please ensure your child is wearing full school uniform and comfortable shoes.
- Your child will need a big packed lunch/tea. We will be eating this on the London Eye at lunchtime and on the train back home for tea.
- Please do not send your child with a camera. All the staff will be taking photos throughout the day.
- All pupils will be wearing high-vis jackets throughout the day and lanyards with mine and Miss Harrison's contact details on.
- Your child can bring a maximum of £5 spending money on the trip. This can be spent in the Houses of Parliament or the National Portrait Gallery.
