



Multi Faith Day

We had our first Multi Faith Day of the year on Tuesday. This term's theme was War and Peace. All the pupils were split into four groups and spent the day taking part in activities organised by Reverend Angela, Mrs Hadwin, Miss Brown and Mr Turley.

Reverend Angela's activity was based on the Christian story of the Israelites walking round the walls of Jericho seven times. The pupils listened to the story then worked together to act the story out. Afterwards, the pupils talked about the meaning of the story and what it teaches them.

In Mrs Hadwin's session the pupils learnt that Buddhists do not believe in taking life or harming living creatures. The pupils went on to talk about what that means for Buddhists who were expected to fight in wars. At the end of the session the pupils made a peace river made from lotus flowers and thought about the importance of living peacefully.

Miss Brown talked to the pupils about how Muslim's trust in Allah and how that gives them peace. The pupils also learnt about how Muslim's use prayer to feel calm and peaceful. The pupils finished the session by discussing and writing about what makes them feel peaceful.



In my session we focused on Judaism. We looked at how Christianity and Judaism are linked, what Jewish people believe, how they pray and the importance of the Prophet Moses. We went on to talk about how Jewish people were persecuted in World War Two. We ended the session by reading the story of Moses saving the Israelites in Egypt.

On Monday, Richard and Lauren from Trash Free Trails visited Class Two for a brilliant workshop. The pupils learnt all about how we can protect woodland trails and wild places in Cumbria. It was great to hear the class talking about what they could do to help look after our local environment. This will help keep our area looking nice and keep the animals safe.

The class learnt about an explorer who have been inside active volcanoes, an ecologist who have helped bring beavers back to the United Kingdom and a climber who hopes to represent United Kingdom in the 2024 Olympics. The morning ended with Andrei Burton, a stunt bmx rider, showcasing his amazing tricks to the class!
