Valentine Disco and Parent Quiz:

DISCO

- -Emma Pomfret happy for disco to happen in school asap. Date of Thursday 10th February agreed for Valentines Disco, as suggested as suitable date by Emma Pomfret.
- -Time of either 5.30pm-6.30pm OR 5:45pm-6:45pm to be agreed by Jo Hayward with Emma Pomfret and After School Club staff, (plus Judith (cleaner), although Emma P may do this?).
- -Jo Hayward will check if Andrea Mounsey is available for music and lights. If Andrea's not available Angela Tyson and husband will be back up.
- sell 'penny' sweets and little packs of love heart sweets in paper bags; crisps; possibly sausage rolls ???; possibly hotdogs in a bread roll; veggie option; dairy free option; cordial. **Angela Tyson will research JMP options available**.
- -Sixty one children currently in school. **Need to check dietary requirements so all catered for if necessary.**
- -Bex Shelton has had discussion with Co-Op about funding opportunities. Co-Op will donate a voucher between £30-£60 to pay for specified goods. Megan Cotton-Dew possibly available to help, although may not be back in time. Angela Tyson may also be available if necessary.

Farmers' Market - Bulb and Cake Sale

FoOS Shed

During the Easter holidays the school playground is being tarmacked. Emma P has requested, if possible, for the FoOS shed to be moved so the whole playground can be tarmacked. This would also help preserve the shed as it could then be moved back into position and raised up on bricks, therefore stopping water ingress through the floor of the shed.

Barnaby will have a look at the shed and advise as to whether or not it will be possible to move it in one piece. If so, the shed will need to be emptied and the contents stored (possibly in school – check with Emma P). A team of helpers will be put together once we know the situation.

Co-Op Grants

Bex Shelton shared further info about the Co-Op grants available to charities. There is a Community Grant available which totals £500. There is a form to fill in which is assessed by an internal committee who will give a response in 6-8 weeks. Bex will research in to the criteria and report back.

There is also a Community Connect grant which is a pot of £9,000 that is split between three winning charities. The top charity will receive £5,000 and the two runners up each receive £2,000. The application process is a lot more involved and will require more input from the FoOS committee to be in with a chance of securing a place in the top three. The final three are voted for by the Co-Op members. The grant applications are open now and winning charities will receive funds in October. Bex S will look in to the paperwork and criteria required and report back. Jo H will discuss with Emma P any funding proposals that school have in mind that may fit the criteria.
