- ... patiently accepts all things.
- ... always trusts, always hopes, and always endures.

How does that feel? Are all of the sentences still true? Christians believe God is love and that when you follow Him and invite His Spirit to live in you He can help you to be truly loving.


Can you find all the vowels (a, e, i, o, u) that haven't been used? Colour them in. What shape appears? It should remind you about an example of true love.
