Programmes of study

Main site – programmes of study

Programme 1: a 3-year KS3 programme of study is available for students who are permanently excluded and struggling to reintegrate back in to a mainstream school or secure a special school place.

Programme 2: a 2-year programme of study is available for both permanently excluded and longterm intervention students who are following the transitional pathway; it may be wholly academic or a blended programme to incorporates elements of vocational learning.

Programme 3: a 6-week intervention programme for KS3 mainstream students who are at risk of permanent exclusion. This is a themed course with a big focus on literacy, numeracy, social emotional development with mentoring/agency intervention and involves 1 full day of Forest School activities. The first 2 weeks are full time, and which is then followed by a phased reintegration over the next 4 weeks, supported by an outreach worker for an hour/week. The aim of this programme is to identify and remove barriers to learning in the hope that the student returns to and successfully remains with their mainstream school.

Programme 4: a 2 term KS3 SEND/Nurture provision for students who require our highest level of support. These students often require daily routines in a safe classroom environment where there is a focus on building positive relationships amid praise and positivity. The aim of this programme is to help identify underlying SEND needs that may support onward referrals. The programme will allow for the graduated response to be completed. For an additional fee an Ed Psych assessment and full report can be provided. Support will also be offered with the application for a statutory assessment. Graduated Response 1 must have already been undertaken for a student to access this programme. A number of students who follow this pathway eventually move onto a special school setting.

Programme 5: a temporary provision for children with high needs who are struggling to access our full-time programmes of study. It involves small group/1:1 learning after school for a limited period of time. Behaviour mentoring, Curriculum for Life and English and Maths are central to this programme

Harvey Street – programmes of study

Programme 1: the curriculum comprises Maths, English, Curriculum for Life and PE. In addition, some students attend either an AP centre where they engage with a City and Guilds course in an area of learning that links to a preferred career or they complete a vocational course at the main site.

Programme 2 - a 6-week intervention programme for KS4 students operates alongside the above and caters for students who are with us on a short-term basis from their mainstream school. The aim of this programme is to identify and remove barriers to learning in the hope that the student may

return to and successfully remains with their mainstream school. Social emotional literacy and personal development is a big part of this programme.

The Heys – a Medical/wellbeing and Mental Health provision

Programme of study – the curriculum follows that of Programme 2 on the main site and is for students who have been referred to us by LCC's medical panel and ELCAS. Students who access this programme are young people who are usually struggling to access their mainstream education due to a range of mental health concerns, including anxiety and depression. Provision is often highly personalised and supportive in the hope that students are able to successfully transition back to their mainstream school or a special school setting/post 16 destination.

Alternative Provision

We work closely with a number of Alternative Providers; namely Creativity Works, 4Tech Motors, Preston Vocational Centre and Trident Military Training. The programmes offered by these providers complements those offered by ourselves and include motor vehicle maintenance, plastering, painting and decoration, bricklaying, hair and beauty, media studies, music, catering and military training. The courses on offer allow students to work towards a number of qualifications including;

- Preston Vocational Centre City and Guilds Level 1 in Construction Skills
- 4Tech Motors Level 1/2 Award in Automotive Maintenance
- Creativity Works NCFE Level 1 Award in Occupational Studies in the Workplace
