

The children have the opportunity to learn team sports and the competitive elements as well as individual activities such as athletics, dance and gymnastics where they may be performing against their personal best.</p> <p>Activities range from year group to year group but the aim is to ensure there is variety and purpose for all year groups.</p> <p>To allow all children to have access to Forest School as part of the provision to keep children active and enjoying the outdoors.</p> <p>We also provide opportunities for Year 4 to take part in Outdoor and Adventurous Activities as part of the PE curriculum.</p>	<p>The PE curriculum is designed to provide a wide variety of experiences for all children in school.
