


Our Lady of the Assumption

Staff Learning

Our staff training and development has progressed at a pace this term. All staff accessed emotional coaching workshops to build on our trauma informed approaches. Curriculum work has progressed through study of researched approaches as well as live training via Blackpool Research School, The Maths Hub, Voice 21 a national Oracy specialist, The English Hub, the Diocese, BEBCMAT central team and most recently The Royal Shakespeare Company. A highlight for our fire safety team included class based study at Blackpool Airport then a trip across the runway in fire engines to then practice extinguishing fires with planes and helicopters landing and taking off around them...very James Bond.

Our children have been really enjoying their leadership responsibilities.

Year 4 have taken on a new role in our school as our resilience team, leading us in wellbeing activities including a fitness activity for all of our pupils as well as simple ways to bring a smile. They have also accessed circus skills workshops and will be building on this in the next term.

Year 5 have been developing all pupils understanding of democracy. During UK Parliament Week they held a whole school vote and will enjoy hosting a whole school dance a thon on Wednesday morning.

Wider Curriculum highlights this term

We've been busy with sport and wider curriculum activities this term and have had much success. Some highlights include: Year 2 made the finals of the Fit2Glow football tournament at Blackpool Tower. Our Year 6 girls' football team won the Blackpool finals and will now go through to the Lancashire schools finals day in January. Our newly formed KS2 cross country club competed in their first event in December with Year 6 girls team taking 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 6th places giving them first place overall. Our Year 5 and 6 boys finished 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 8th.

Our dance club are busy preparing for Schools Alive with weekly rehearsals and our choir have performed at community events and attended The Mayors Parlour for a Christmas event. The choir will be sharing their skills on Thursday at the Key Stage 2 Carol Service.





Bikeability Success

You may have noticed we had lots of bikes around school for the last half term.



This was due to Bikeability courses running for Year 5 and 6 this term. This is an incredible offer of two days training which is free for the children to access. They spend one morning on the school site on their Level 1 and then if they pass this progress to Level 2 which is training on the roads to learn to navigate safely. They are taken out in small groups with extremely experienced trainers. For some the weather was very mixed but they showed excellent resilience to achieve the Level 2 Award.

This is a great opportunity for pupils to access high quality training in such a valuable life skill. Congratulations to all who took part and thanks to their families for support with bikes and the appropriate clothing for the event.
