Landscape

What do we mean when we talk about the landscape of a particular area in the UK?

Landscape

This is the definition from 'National Geographic':

A landscape is part of the Earth's surface that can be viewed at one time from one place. It consists of the geographic features that mark, or are characteristic of a particular area.

Now let's look at two different types of landscape.....

An **urban landscape** is the region surrounding a city. Most inhabitants of urban areas have nonagricultural jobs. Urban areas are very developed, meaning there is a density of human structures such as houses, commercial buildings, roads, bridges, and railways.





- A **rural landscape** is the opposite of urban areas. Rural areas, often called "the country," have low population density and large amounts of undeveloped land. Usually, the difference between a rural area and an urban area is clear.

Is Blackpool Rural or Urban?

Blackpool is an **URBAN** town. It is a built up area with a large population, many buildings and human features.

Blackpool is also on the coast, meaning we have a beach and can see the sea. This is why Blackpool is also known as a **SEASIDE RESORT**. In this respect, Blackpool also has a huge physical feature!

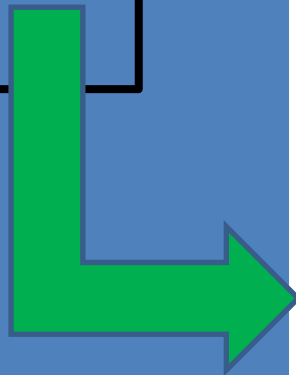
1. What kind of area do you live in?
