Remember to start your sentences with 'bossy' imperatives. Can you include first, next, then and after in your writing?	Go on a 'shape hunt' around your house. Can you identify any 2d and 3d shapes? Create a picture using 2d shapes. Have you used a circle, triangle, square, rectangle, pentagon and hexagon? Can you tell an adult how many sides these shapes have?
