Year 7, 8 & 11 Examination Outcomes

During the first two weeks of term, we will be reviewing examination outcomes for Years 7, 8, and 11. Parents and carers received Data Checks just before Christmas. Some students have performed exceptionally well and others have consistently demonstrated a positive attitude to learning throughout the term. Students who have achieved outstanding results will receive letters of congratulation. For students whose results were below expectations, additional support will be put in place to help them improve. Parents and carers will be invited to meet with pastoral staff to discuss strategies and ensure that every student receives the guidance and support they need to succeed. We are committed to celebrating achievement while supporting all students to reach their full potential.

Attendance & Examination Performance

Having analysed the recent examination results for Years 7, 8, and 11, it is clear that attendance has a significant impact on academic performance. Students with attendance of 95% or higher consistently achieve substantially better results than those with lower attendance. In Years 7 and 8, **students who have missed more than three days** in the Autumn term have achieved **7–10% lower examination scores** compared with their peers with higher attendance.

In Year 11, the impact is even more pronounced. Among students with attendance below 95%, the **average proportion achieving Grade 4 or above in English and Maths is 42% lower** than those with higher attendance. These findings highlight the importance of regular school attendance and the direct link between being in class and academic success. Below are some specific examples from individual subjects.
