We are especially delighted to welcome our new Year 7 students, as well as those joining us in other year groups. We wish them every success as they settle into school life and become part of our community.

Year 11 Leavers

A huge congratulations to our Year 11 Leavers who achieved a fantastic set of examination results. Key highlights included:

- A rise in the number of students achieving grades 9–5 in both English and Mathematics, reflecting the school's commitment to academic outcomes.
- Seven exceptional students securing grade 9s in RE, alongside many others who achieved clusters of grade 9s across a range of subjects, including English, Geography, Maths, Biology, History and Photography.
- Outstanding results in Separate Sciences, with an impressive 89% of students achieving grades 9–4 in Biology,
 Chemistry and Physics.
- Excellent vocational outcomes, with 40% of students achieving the top grades of Distinction* or Distinction in Sports Studies, and an outstanding 83% of students securing a Level 2 Pass or higher in Health & Social Care.

These results reflected the hard work, determination, and ambition of both students and staff, and the school is proud to celebrate the success of Year 11 as students move forward to the next stage of their education. Most students have progressed to Sixth Form Colleges or apprenticeships.

- Speak out for debt relief


Catholic Schools have been asked by the Bishops' Conference to think of ways in which they can make the world a better place and to create a school pledge as part of the Jubilee Year.

School Expectations

At the start of the school year, we focus on the School Expectations:



Attendance

We remind students about the importance of high levels of attendance, being in school every day on time. Students who are absent from school because of holidays taken in term-time are placed at a huge disadvantage. I would like to remind parents and carers that family holidays should not be taken during term time. In line with government regulations, we are unable to authorise holidays during the school term, and any unauthorised absence of this kind will result in a fixed penalty notice being issued by the Local Authority.

Research shows that good attendance at school provides students with routines and structure, positive social interaction and the variety of activities helps support improved mental health and physical well-being.

Here is the current information on Fixed Penalty Notices (FPNs) for unauthorised school absences (such as term-time holidays) in England as of August 2025 provided by the government:

Fixed Penalty Notice Costs & Payment Deadlines

- First Holiday:
 - o £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days (early payment discount)
 - o £160 per parent per child if paid after 21 days but within 28 days
- Second Holiday (within a rolling three-year period):
 - o £160 per parent per child, with no discount available
- Third Holiday or more within 3 years:
 - o No further FPN is issued.
 - The case is referred directly to Magistrates' Court, where fines can be issued up to £2,500, and legal action (such as a criminal record) may follow

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Behaviour

In assembly and during form-time this week we have reminded all students about the high standards of behaviour and presentation expected in school, which includes wearing the correct uniform. I am grateful to the overwhelming majority of families who have supported this by ensuring that students have arrived this week dressed smartly. I am aware that some parents are awaiting items from the uniform supplier. These will hopefully arrive very soon.

A small number of students need to address a few issues this weekend: false eyelashes and acrylic nails are not permitted, shoes must be plain black leather, and all students should bring a suitable school bag. Piercings and jewellery are not allowed. Students need to address these issues as a priority and ensure that they are following the school's expectations.

In addition, chewing gum is not permitted anywhere on the school site. Mobile phones must not be seen or heard during the school day; if they are, they will be confiscated in line with school policy.
