Dear Parents & Carers,

We have had a very busy few days! Thank you to all parents and carers who attended the Year Group Information Evenings over the past two weeks. It is always wonderful to meet our families and share our focus on both the academic and pastoral development of our students.

Attendance

Thank you to all parents and carers who support their child in attending school every day. Unfortunately, since the beginning of term, we have seen a significant dip in **attendance on Fridays**. Individual families will be contacted if trends in attendance on Fridays continue to cause concern. Missing school on a Friday has a serious impact on students academically. Students who do not attend:

- Miss 5 lessons of learning a day
- Struggle to fully understand the curriculum
- Develop gaps in their learning, which affects performance in tests and assessments
- Experience increased anxiety and difficulty in completing homework
- Achieve lower grades compared to their peers

We encourage you to help build your child's resilience by ensuring they attend school every Friday. If you need support to help your child attend school consistently, please contact us. Persistent absence is defined as attendance below 90%. We have had 18 school days so far this term; missing just two days already brings attendance below 90%. Our school target for all students is 97%.
