Our Daily Examen and October Devotions

Each day at the start of Lesson 4, pupils take part in our Daily Examen — a reflective prayer helping them pause, give thanks, and recognise God's presence in their day. This long-standing tradition supports pupils to grow in self-awareness, gratitude, and faith.

October is a special month in the Church, dedicated to Mary and the Rosary. Our Examens this month feature devotional prayers:

- The Memorare asking for Mary's help and comfort.
- The Angelus recalling the moment God became human through Mary.
- The Glory Be giving praise to the Holy Trinity.

Through these prayers, pupils reflect on Mary's example of faith and deepen their relationship with God.

Attendance

Our Catholic ethos calls us to nurture resilience, responsibility and commitment to community in our pupils. Attending school daily, and on time, is essential for developing these virtues. Research also clearly demonstrates that frequent absence often leads to poor academic performance. Attending school consistently, helps pupils stay engaged, participate fully, and build meaningful relationships. With this in mind, please schedule non-urgent medical and dental appointments outside of school hours whenever possible. Family holidays and trips should occur during breaks, not during term time. Holidays taken during term time, in accordance with our attendance policy, will be unauthorised.
