## Year 7 Numeracy & Literacy Catch-up Premium Expenditure – Report to Local Governing Committees 2020-21

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium provide schools funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve <u>the expected standard</u> in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2.

For the 2019 to 2020 academic year schools must publish:

- details of how you spent your allocation for that year
- how your use of that allocation made a difference to the attainment of the pupils who benefit from the funding

As final payments of the Year 7 catch-up premium were made in relation to the 2019 to 2020 academic year, the 2020 to 2021 academic year will be the last year on which schools must report how this funding was used.

## **Key objectives for use of Year 7 Catch-up Grant**

To provide additional strategies and support for pupils that have not made the expected standard by the end of KS2. To ensure that these strategies are targeted correctly by carrying out testing for reading ages and literacy skills.

To ensure pupils that need support in English and Maths are given targeted help that is in addition to the normal classroom and to ensure this is targeted on the literacy and numeracy skills that have been carefully identified.

Improve the attainment of those students entitled to Catch up Premium, who did not meet the expected standard in KS2 in line with other pupils in the cohort that were working at the expected standard in KS2. Provide additional educational support to improve the progress and to raise the standards in Reading and Maths for these pupils.

Pupils in the catch-up group made an average of 3 sub levels of progress in Maths and 2.9 sub levels of progress in English by the end of Yr8.
Pupils not in the catch-up group made on average 2.7 sub levels of progress in maths and 2.9 sub levels of progress in English by the end of Yr8.
95.2% of pupils in the catch-up group made two or more sublevels of progress in Maths and 84.5% of pupils made 2 or more sublevels of progress in English by the end of Yr8.
