Habemus Papam

Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, a 69-year-old Chicago native, has been elected as the 267th Pope of the Roman Catholic Church. He has chosen the name Pope Leo XIV, becoming the first American to ascend to the papacy.

Pope Leo XIV was elected on the second day of the conclave, following the death of Pope Francis on April 21, 2025. The announcement was made from the central balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, where the new pope greeted the faithful with the words, "Peace be with all of you."

During his first mass, he taught:

1. Go out and evangelise!

Drawing on his missionary roots in Peru, he called us to spread the Gospel with courage and compassion.

2. Lead with humility

Describing his papacy as both a "cross and a blessing," he encouraged Church leaders to serve with humility and let Christ lead.

3. Inclusion and simplicity

Two women read Scripture during the Mass, and Pope Leo chose simple black shoes and modest housing—showing the power of simplicity.
