



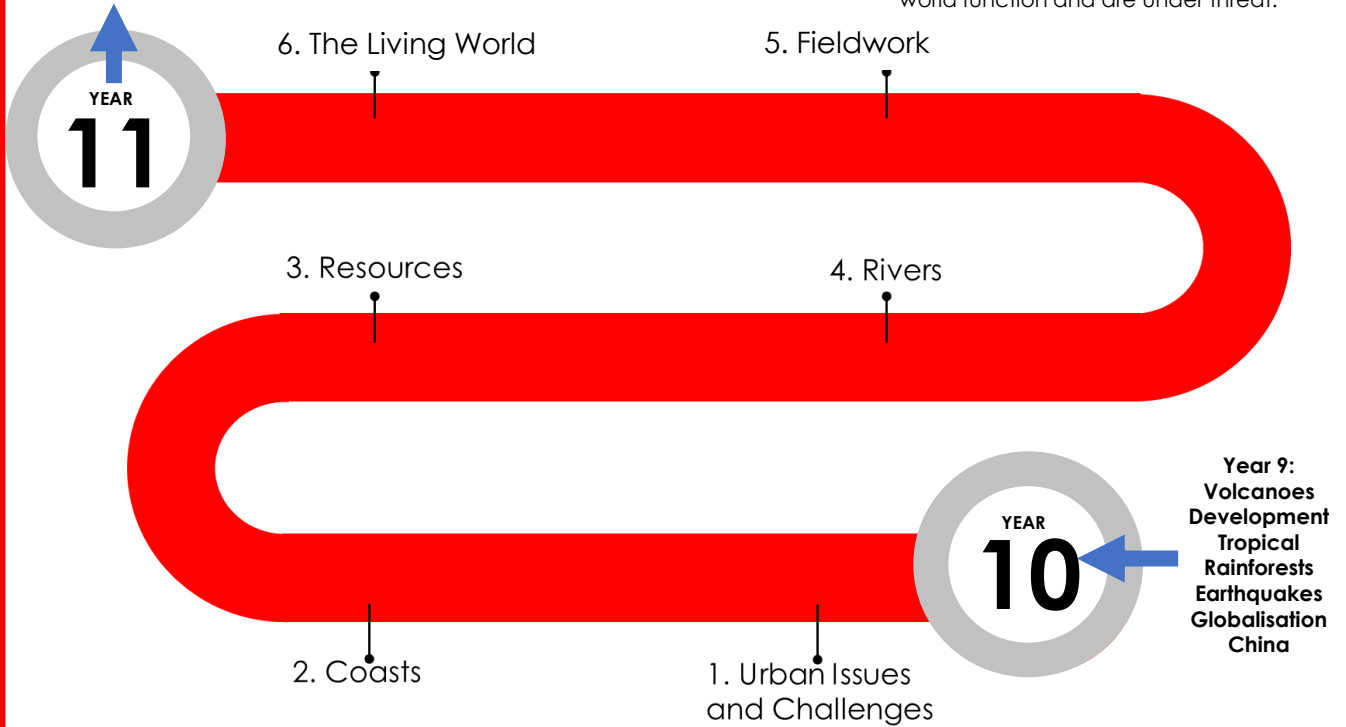
# MY LEARNING JOURNEY- Year 10

- Carry out 2 fieldwork inquiries, analyse and present your results.
- Understand how different Biomes in the world function and are under threat.

**Year 11 Topic 1:  
Natural Hazards**



Topic	Overview	Why here? Why now?
Paper 2: Section A: Urban Issues and Challenges	More than half of the world now lives in cities, why are cities around the world growing? What problems does this create? You will look at Rio de Janeiro and London as your major case studies.	We start the GCSE course with this topic as it builds upon your knowledge of development, globalisation and China from Year 9.
Paper 1: Section C: Coasts	Coastlines around the world are under threat by rising sea levels and flooding, why? How can we manage this?	Picking up where you left off in Year 8 you will focus on coasts and sustainability in far greater depth.
Paper 2: Section C: Resources	Fossil Fuel consumption is the biggest cause of climate change, what are they? Why do we use them?	Sustainability has been a thread through all of your KS3 topics, here we tackle the biggest challenge for sustainability.
Paper 1: Section C: Rivers	The vast majority of the world live around a river, how do they influence the land and how do we influence them?	Building on similar processes from Coasts, you will revisit UK physical landscapes in more detail.
Paper 1: Section B: The Living World	Who are the people, plants and animals that live in the Sahara and the Amazon? How are they under threat?	Revisiting similar themes from Year 8 and Year 9 you will examine in far greater depth 2 major case studies.
Paper 3: Fieldwork	You will plan and carry out your own investigation along the coastline and analyse your results!	So you can apply the information from Urban Issues and Coasts from earlier in the year into real life.
